- **2.** Those under royal rule believed that they must obey the king as they would obey God. How does the position of the king in this cartoon give him a God-like presence?
- 3. Is the cartoonist in favor of or opposed to the theory of divine right? How do you know?
- **4. Making Comparisons** What do you think is the difference between a king and a dictator? Explain how the cartoon illustrates this distinction.
